TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Payment terms

1. The terms of payment are strictly thirty (30) days (or such other period as nominated by the supplier herein) from the date of invoice. PFP (Aust) Pty Ltd ABN 31 062 673 223 and its related bodies corporate (as that term is defined in the *Corporations Act 2001*) (**Supplier**) may, at any time, upon the provision of 48 hours' written notice to the Applicant, vary the terms and conditions of trade.
2. If the Applicant does not agree with the variations proposed by the Supplier, they must notify the Supplier in writing within fourteen (14) days from receipt of the written notice that the variations are not agreed to. The Supplier and/or the Applicant will then be at liberty to suspend/withdraw credit facilities if no agreement can be reached between the parties regarding the proposed variations. Absent notice from the Applicant, the varied terms and conditions of trade may be deemed accepted. Clerical errors (such as spelling mistakes or grammatical errors) may be subject to correction without notification.
3. The Applicant must check all invoices and advise the Supplier of any errors or omissions within seven (7) days of receipt. Failing advice from the Applicant that the invoices contain any errors or omissions, the invoice may be deemed accepted by the Supplier.
4. Should the Applicant not pay for the goods or services supplied by the Supplier in accordance with the credit terms as provided herein, or as agreed in writing by the Supplier and Applicant from time to time after issuing a written demand to the Applicant demanding payment within fourteen (14) days, the Supplier will be entitled to charge an administration fee of 10 percent of the amount of the invoice payable.

Jurisdiction

5. The Applicant acknowledges and agrees that this agreement will be governed by the laws of Western Australia, and the laws of the Commonwealth of Australia which are in force in Western Australia.
6. The Applicant acknowledges and agrees that any contract for the supply of goods or services between the Supplier and the Applicant is formed at the address of the Supplier.
7. The parties to this agreement submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Western Australia and the relevant federal courts and courts competent to hear appeals from those courts.

Price

8. Unless otherwise agreed in writing, the price charged for the Goods shall be exclusive of any GST and as per the price specified in the Order.
9. Unless otherwise agreed in writing between the parties, all prices are strictly net of any taxes or delivery charges. Goods and Services Tax (**GST**), sales tax or any other applicable tax or duty payable must be paid by or reimbursed by the Applicant to the Supplier on demand and the Applicant must indemnify and keep the Supplier indemnified in respect of all taxes and duties (including GST) arising out of any sale of Goods or the subsequent use of Goods after sale to the Applicant.

Delivery

10. The Supplier will make all reasonable efforts to have the Goods delivered to the Applicant as indicated on any relevant order or correspondence. The Applicant agrees, however, failure to do so does not confer on the Applicant any right to cancel the order or refuse delivery or render the Supplier liable for any loss or damages directly or indirectly sustained by the Applicant as a result of any difference between the estimated time and actual date of delivery.
11. Except for where there has been negligence, the Supplier shall be entitled to recover from the Applicant any reasonable additional costs incurred by Supplier due to any failure by the Applicant to accept the Goods at time of delivery or default by the Supplier.

Warranties

12. The Supplier warrants that:
 - (a) the Goods when delivered to the Applicant will comply with any description for the goods contained in the relevant order and satisfy the requirements of any Australian standards specified in the order or any comparable international standards that apply to the Goods; and
 - (b) the Goods are new, free from defects, or merchantable quality, conform with any specifications provided in the Contract and fit for the purpose for which the Goods would ordinarily be used or as specified by the manufacturer;
13. The Applicant acknowledges, agrees, represents and warrants that the use of the Goods is outside the control of Supplier, the Applicant is satisfied that the Goods when supplied in accordance with clause 12 will have the condition characteristics, quality and attributes that will make them suitable or fit for any ordinary or special purpose required for those Goods, even if that purpose is made known to Supplier at any time.
14. The Applicant agrees that, unless expressly agreed by Supplier in writing, it has made its own enquiries in relation to the suitability of the Goods for its own purpose and does not rely on representations by Supplier in relation to their suitability for a particular purpose or any steps which may need to be taken in relation to their use.

Default

15. The Applicant will be in default if:
 - (a) fails to make payment in accordance to Clause 1;
 - (b) fails in any material respect to comply with these Terms and Conditions;
 - (c) being a body corporate it becomes and externally-administrated body corporate or has an application for winding up filed against it;
 - (d) being an individual, it commits an act of bankruptcy or becomes an insolvent under administration;
16. If the Applicant Defaults, the Supplier may, with the provision of written notice:
 - (a) cease all further deliveries; and/or
 - (b) terminate any agreement in relation to Goods that have not been delivered; and/or
 - (c) claim the return of any Goods in the Applicant's possession where title has not passed to the Applicant;
 - (d) the Applicant hereby indemnifies the Supplier against prosecution and claims for damages resulting from seizure of the Goods; and/or
 - (e) withdraw or vary any credit the Supplier has provided to the Applicant.
17. If the Supplier defaults in supply of the Goods, the Applicant may:
 - (a) require the Supplier to repair or modify the defective Goods to the extent the Supplier is no longer in default;
 - (b) where (a) is not reasonably feasible, require the Supplier to replace the defective Goods; or
 - (c) where neither (a) nor (b) is reasonably feasible, either party may cancel the order and the Supplier shall refund any amount paid by the Applicant in relation to the cancelled Goods.
18. that the Applicant agrees that the Supplier shall not be liable for defects or deficiencies in Goods caused by the improper installation or maintenance of Goods or related components; normal wear and tear and damage and any Consequential Loss or any costs relating to disassembly, removal and/or re-installation of the Goods.
19. Any claims by the Applicant in respect of defective Goods or damaged Goods must be made in writing within 28 days of the delivery of the Goods, unless a longer period is expressly agreed by the Supplier in writing.

Returns

20. The Supplier is not under any obligation to accept Goods returned by the Applicant, unless agreed in writing and the application for credit has been submitted by the Applicant in writing, within 30 calendar days from the date of supply.
21. The Applicant shall not return any Goods to the Supplier without a Credit Return Authority Number, which must be identified on the goods and also the returning paperwork. Return of goods must occur within 14 calendar days from the issue of the Credit Return Authority Number, unless otherwise agreed in writing.
22. The return of goods which are not a direct result of nonconforming supply from the Supplier, will incur a 15 % re- stocking fee that will be calculated on the net sale price of the goods, and/or a minimum fee of \$150, whichever is the greater sum.

23. The cost for the return of Goods to the Supplier is the responsibility of the Applicant and any loss or damage to the goods being returned, is the responsibility of the Applicant.
24. For goods that were not supplied from the Supplier's inventory, purchased specifically for the Applicant's order and/or the goods were modified to meet the Applicant's requirements, will not be accepted for credit, unless otherwise specifically agreed in writing.
25. All Goods returned by the Applicant, shall be inspected by the Supplier within a reasonable time frame from receipt, which is to verify the goods are of good quality and reasonable unused condition, thereafter a decision shall be made with respect to the approval of the application for credit.
26. The Applicant acknowledges that the Supplier is not be under any liability to issue credit for any Goods that have been damaged or altered in any way after risk has passed.
27. The Applicant acknowledges that outstanding funds shall not be withheld from the Supplier pending review and approval of returned goods for credit, unless specifically agreed otherwise in writing.

Security/charges

28. The Applicant charges in favour of the Supplier all of its estate and interest in any real property that the Applicant owns at present and in the future with the amount of its indebtedness hereunder until discharged.
29. The Applicant charges in favour of the Supplier all of its estate and interest in any personal property that the Applicant owns at present and in the future with the amount of its indebtedness hereunder until discharged.
30. The Applicant appoints as its duly constituted attorney the Supplier's company secretary from time to time to execute in the Applicant's name and as the Applicant's act and deed any real property mortgage, bill of sale or consent to any caveat the Supplier may choose to lodge against real property that the Applicant may own in any Land Titles Office in any state or territory of Australia, even though the Applicant may not have defaulted in carrying out its obligations hereunder, upon written notice and demand to the Applicant (in the event that there is no default by the Applicant in carrying out its obligations hereunder).
31. Where the Applicant has previously entered into an agreement with the Supplier by which the Applicant has granted a charge, mortgage or other security interest (including a security interest as defined in the *Personal Property Securities Act 2009 (PPSA)*) over or in respect of real or personal property, those charges, mortgages or other security interests and the terms which directly or indirectly create rights, powers or obligations in respect thereto will continue and co-exist with the obligations and security interests created in this agreement and will secure all indebtedness and obligations of the Applicant under this agreement. The Supplier may, at its election and upon the provision of written reasons to the Applicant, vary the terms of such previous charges, mortgages or other securities to reflect the terms herein.

Purpose of credit

32. The Applicant acknowledges and agrees that the credit to be provided to the Applicant by the Supplier is to be applied wholly or predominantly for commercial purposes.

Formation of contract

33. Quotations made by the Supplier will not be construed as an offer or obligation to supply in accordance with the quotation. The Supplier reserves the right to accept or reject, at its discretion, any offer to purchase received by it. Only written acceptance by the Supplier of the Applicant's offer will complete a contract.
34. Placement of an order, either verbally or in writing, will imply acceptance of the Supplier's offer and of these terms and conditions.

Retention of title

35. Title in the goods does not pass to the Applicant until the Applicant has made payment in full for the goods and, further, until the Applicant has made payment in full of all the other money owing by the Applicant to the Supplier (whether in respect of money payable under a specific contract or on any other account whatsoever).
36. Whilst the Applicant has not paid for the goods supplied in full at any time, the Applicant agrees that property and title in the goods will not pass to the Applicant and the Supplier retains the legal and equitable title in those goods supplied and not yet sold.
37. Until payment in full has been made to the Supplier, the Applicant will hold the goods in a fiduciary capacity for the Supplier and agrees to store the goods in such a manner that they can be identified as the property of the Supplier, and will not mix the goods with other similar goods.
38. The Applicant will be entitled to sell the goods in the ordinary course of its business, but until full payment for the goods has been made to the Supplier, the Applicant will sell as agent and bailee for the Supplier and the proceeds of sale of the goods will be held by the Applicant on trust for the Supplier absolutely.
39. The Applicant's indebtedness to the Supplier, whether in full or in part, will not be discharged by the operation of clause 38 hereof unless and until the funds held on trust are remitted to the Supplier.
40. The Applicant agrees that whilst property and title in the goods remains with the Supplier, the Supplier has the right, with prior notice to the Applicant, to enter upon any premises occupied by the Applicant (or any receiver, receiver and manager, administrator, liquidator or trustee in bankruptcy of the Applicant) to inspect the goods of the Supplier and to repossess the goods which may be in the Applicant's possession, custody or control when payment is overdue.
41. The Applicant will be responsible for the Supplier's reasonable costs and expenses in exercising its rights under clause 40. Where the Supplier exercises any power to enter the premises, that entry will not give rise to any action of trespass or similar action on the part of the Applicant against the Supplier, its employees, servants or agents.
42. The Applicant agrees that where the goods have been retaken into the possession of the Supplier, the Supplier has the absolute right to sell or deal with the goods, and if necessary, sell the goods with the trademark or name of the Applicant on those goods, and the Applicant hereby grants an irrevocable licence to the Supplier to do all things necessary to sell the goods bearing the name or trademark of the Applicant.
43. For the avoidance of doubt, the Supplier's interest constitutes a 'purchase money security interest' pursuant to the PPSA.

Cancellation of terms of credit

44. The Supplier reserves the right to withdraw credit at any time.
45. Upon cancellation with or without notice all liabilities incurred by the Applicant become immediately due and payable to the Supplier.

Indemnity

46. The Applicant agrees to indemnify the Supplier and keep the Supplier indemnified against any claim that arises out of the goods and services supplied under this agreement. This indemnity includes any legal fees and expenses the Supplier incurs in order to enforce its rights, on an indemnity basis.

Provision of further information

47. The Applicant undertakes to comply with any reasonable written requests by the Supplier to provide further information for the purpose of assessing the Applicant's creditworthiness, including an updated credit application.
48. If the Applicant is a corporation (with the exception of a public listed company), it must advise the Supplier of any alteration to its corporate structure (for example, by changing directors, shareholders, or its constitution). In the case of a change of directors or shareholders the Supplier may ask for new guarantors to sign a guarantee and indemnity.

Corporations

49. If the Applicant is a corporation, the Applicant warrants that all of its directors have signed this agreement and that all of its directors may be required to enter into a guarantee and indemnity with the Supplier in relation to the Applicant's obligations to the Supplier.

Trustee capacity

- 50. If the Applicant is the trustee of a trust (whether disclosed to the Supplier or not), the Applicant warrants to the Supplier that:
 - (a) the Applicant enters into this agreement in both its capacity as trustee and in its personal capacity;
 - (b) the Applicant has the right to be reasonably indemnified out of trust assets;
 - (c) the Applicant has the power under the trust deed to sign this agreement; and
 - (d) the Applicant will not retire as trustee of the trust or appoint any new or additional trustee without advising the Supplier.
- 51. The Applicant must give the Supplier a copy of the trust deed upon request.

Partnership

- 52. If the Applicant enters into this agreement as partners, the Applicant warrants that all of the partners have signed this agreement and that all of the partners may be required to enter into a guarantee and indemnity with the Supplier in relation to the Applicant's obligations to the Supplier.
- 53. If the Applicant is a partnership, it must not alter its partnership (for example, adding or removing partners or altering its partnership agreement) without advising the Supplier. In the case of a change of partners, the Supplier may ask for new guarantors to sign a guarantee and indemnity.

Insolvency

- 54. If the Applicant becomes insolvent, the Applicant remains liable under this agreement for payment of all liabilities incurred hereunder. The Applicant remains liable under this agreement even if the Supplier receives a dividend or payment as a result of the Applicant being insolvent.

Waiver

- 55. A waiver of any provision or breach of this agreement by the Supplier must be made by an authorised officer of the Supplier in writing. A waiver of any provision or breach of this agreement by the Applicant must be made by the Applicant's authorised officer in writing.
- 56. Until ownership of the goods passes, the Applicant waives its rights it would otherwise have under the PPSA (unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Supplier and the Applicant):
 - (a) under section 95 to receive notice of intention to remove an accession;
 - (b) under section 118 to receive notice that the Supplier intends to enforce its security interest in accordance with land law;
 - (c) under section 121(4) to receive a notice of enforcement action against liquid assets;
 - (d) under section 129 to receive a notice of disposal of goods by the Supplier purchasing the goods;
 - (e) under section 130 to receive a notice to dispose of goods;
 - (f) under section 132(2) to receive a statement of account following disposal of goods;
 - (g) under section 132(4) to receive a statement of account if no disposal of goods for each 6 month period;
 - (h) under section 135 to receive notice of any proposal of the Supplier to retain goods;
 - (i) under section 137(2) to object to any proposal of the Supplier to retain or dispose of goods;
 - (j) under section 142 to redeem the goods;
 - (k) under section 143 to reinstate the security agreement; and
 - (l) under section 157(1) and 157(3) to receive a notice of any verification statement.

Costs

- 57. The Applicant must pay for its own legal, accounting and business costs and all costs incurred by the Supplier relating to any default by the Applicant under this agreement. The Applicant must also pay for all stamp duty and other taxes payable on this agreement (if any).
- 58. The Applicant will pay the Supplier's costs and disbursements incurred in pursuing any recovery action, or any other claim or remedy, against the Applicant, including collection costs, debt recovery fees and legal costs on an indemnity basis.
- 59. Subject to clauses 60 and 62, payments by, or on behalf of, the Applicant will be applied by the Supplier as follows:
 - (a) Firstly, in payment of any and all collection costs and legal costs in accordance with clauses 41 and 58.
 - (b) Secondly, in payment of any interest incurred in accordance with clause 65.
 - (c) Thirdly, in payment of the outstanding invoice(s).
- 60. In circumstances where the Supplier seeks to enforce a purchase money security interest under the PPSA over collateral or proceeds (these terms being consistent with the terms defined in the PPSA), payments received from the Applicant will be allocated in a manner at the Supplier's absolute and unfettered discretion, so as to attribute, to the greatest extent possible, the unpaid balance of the debt to the purchase money obligation in respect of the collateral and/or proceeds over which the Supplier seeks to enforce its purchase money security interest.
- 61. To the extent that payments have been allocated to invoices by the Supplier in its business records, the Supplier may, in its sole and unfettered discretion, allocate and/or retrospectively reallocate payments in any manner whatsoever at the Supplier's absolute discretion, including in a manner inconsistent with clause 60 herein.
- 62. Payments allocated (and/or reallocated) under clause 60 and/or 61 will be treated as though they were allocated or reallocated, respectively, in the manner determined by the Supplier on the date of receipt of payment.

Taxes and duty

- 63. The Applicant must pay GST on any taxable supply made by the Supplier to the Applicant under this agreement. The payment of GST is in addition to any other consideration payable by the Applicant for a taxable supply.
- 64. If as a result of:
 - (a) any legislation becoming applicable to the subject matter of this agreement; or
 - (b) any changes in legislation or its interpretation by a court of competent jurisdiction or by any authority charged with its administration;
 the Supplier becomes liable to pay any tax, duty, excise or levy in respect of the amounts received from the Applicant, then the Applicant must pay the Supplier these additional amounts on 48 hours' written demand.

Interest rates

- 65. The interest rate on any outstanding debts is a fixed rate of 10 per cent per annum.

Set-off

- 66. All payments required to be made by the Applicant under this agreement will be made free of any set-off, or counterclaim and without deduction or withholding, unless agreed to otherwise by the Supplier and the Applicant in writing. Any reasonable requests to set-off or withhold amounts outstanding will be considered by the Supplier.
- 67. Any amount due to the Supplier from time to time may be deducted from any monies which may be or may become payable to the Applicant by the Supplier.

Limitation of Liability

- 68. The Supplier's liability to the Applicant (and any party claiming through the Applicant against the Supplier) for any claim for loss or damages (including legal expenses) made in connection with the order (including the supply of Goods described in the order) whether in contract, tort (including negligence), under statute, in equity or otherwise shall be strictly limited as follows (except to the extent that the law prohibits such a limitation):
 - (a) For any liability arising from Goods not meeting the specification or which are said to be defective or deficient, to the cost of replacement of those Goods as soon as reasonably practicable, or the repair of those Goods or the repayment (or allowance) of the invoice price of those Goods (at the option of The Supplier);
 - (b) For any liability arising from the services not meeting the scope or which are said to be otherwise defective or deficient, the Supplier's liability is limited to the provision of the services again or payment for the cost of having the relevant services provided (at the option of the Supplier); and
 - (c) In the case of claims for loss or damage to physical property, to \$20 million;

- 69. Unless the amount recoverable under the Supplier's insurance in respect of damages (where the event or events giving rise to the damages are insured under the insurance policies) is higher, in which case that higher amount applies.
- 70. The Supplier shall not be liable, to the maximum extent permitted by law, for any indirect, special or consequential loss or damage of any nature whatsoever resulting from or caused in any way by the Goods it supplies, where "indirect, special or consequential loss or damage" includes: (A) any loss of income, profit, production, contract, Applicants, business opportunity or business; (B) any loss of goodwill or reputation; (C) any loss of value of intellectual property; (D) any loss or damage resulting from the loss or damage to goods other than the Goods.

Shortages

- 71. The Applicant will inspect and check all Goods received as soon as practicable upon unloading. No claim by the Applicant for shortages of Goods may be made unless such claim is notified to the Supplier with forty-eight (48) hours of such inspection.

Miscellaneous

- 72. The Supplier is not liable for any loss caused to the Applicant by reason of strikes, lockouts, fires, riots, war, embargoes, civil commotions, acts of God or any other activity beyond the Supplier's control.
- 73. In relation to the supply of goods, the Supplier's liability is limited to:
 - (a) replacing the goods or supplying similar goods;
 - (b) repairing the goods;
 - (c) providing the cost for replacing the goods or for acquiring equivalent goods; and
 - (d) providing the cost for having the goods repaired.
- 74. In relation to the supply of services, the Supplier's liability is limited to:
 - (a) supplying the service again; or
 - (b) providing for the cost of having the services supplied again.
- 75. The Supplier is not liable for loss of profit, economic or financial loss, damages, consequential loss, loss of opportunity or benefit, loss of a right or any other indirect loss suffered by the Applicant as a result of the goods and/or services supplied under this agreement.
- 76. The Applicant will, at the request of the Supplier, execute documents and do such further acts as may be required for the Supplier to register the security interest granted by the Applicant under the PPSA.
- 77. The Applicant agrees to accept service of any document required to be served, including any notice under this agreement or the PPSA or any originating process, by prepaid post at any address nominated in this application or any other address later notified to the Supplier by the Applicant or the Applicant's authorised representative.
- 78. The Applicant further agrees that where we have rights in addition to those under part 4 of the PPSA, those rights will continue to apply.
- 79. The Applicant irrevocably grants to the Supplier the right to enter upon the Applicant's property or premises, with notice, and without being in any way liable to the Applicant or to any third party, if the Supplier has cause to exercise any of their rights under sections 123 and/or 128 of the PPSA, and the Applicant shall reasonably indemnify the Supplier from any claims made by any third party as a result of such exercise.
- 80. Nothing in this agreement shall be read or applied so as to purport to exclude, restrict or modify or have the effect of excluding, restricting or modifying the application in relation to the supply of any goods and/or services pursuant to this agreement of all or any of the provisions the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* or any relevant State or Federal Legislation which by law cannot be excluded, restricted or modified.

Severance

- 81. If any provision of this agreement is not enforceable in accordance with its terms, other provisions which are self-sustaining are, and continue to be, enforceable in accordance with their terms.
- 82. If any part of this agreement is invalid or unenforceable, that part is deleted and the remainder of the agreement remains effective.

Variation

- 83. The Applicant agrees that these terms and conditions may be varied, added to, or amended by an authorised officer of the Supplier at any time by written notice to the Applicant. The Applicant will be provided with fourteen (14) days to accept the variation/s, failing which the variations may be deemed accepted by the Supplier.
- 84. Any proposed variation to these terms and conditions by the Applicant must be requested in writing. The Supplier may refuse any such request without providing reasons either orally or in writing.
- 85. Variations requested by the Applicant will only be binding upon the Supplier if they are accepted in writing.

Consent to register

- 86. The Applicant hereby consents to the Supplier recording the details of this Agreement on the Personal Property Securities Register and agrees to do all things necessary and reasonably required by the Supplier to effect such registration.
- 87. The Applicant waives any right or entitlement to receive notice of the registration of any security interest(s) created by this instrument on the Personal Property Securities Register.

Entire agreement

- 88. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating in any way to its subject matter, unless agreed to otherwise by the Supplier and the Applicant in writing. All previous negotiations, understandings, representations, warranties, memoranda or commitments about the subject matter of this agreement are merged in this agreement and are of no further effect. No oral explanation or information provided by a party to another affects the meaning or interpretation of this agreement or constitutes any collateral agreement, warranty or understanding.
- 89. Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, in circumstances where there is a pre-existing written credit agreement (**Original Agreement**) between the Applicant and the Supplier, these terms and this agreement will constitute a variation of the Original Agreement whereby the terms of the Original Agreement are deleted and replaced with the terms herein, unless the terms of the Original Agreement are otherwise expressly or implicitly preserved by the terms herein in which case they will co-exist with the terms herein, and, to the extent of any inconsistency, these terms will prevail.

Privacy Act

- 90. The Applicant agrees to the terms of the Privacy Statement pursuant to the *Privacy Act 1988* (as amended by the *Privacy Amendment (Enhancing Privacy Protection) Act 2012* contained in this document.

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(Guarantors) hereby covenant and undertake and if more than one, jointly and severally, as follows.

Jurisdiction

1. The Guarantors acknowledge and agree that this guarantee and indemnity is governed by the laws of Western Australia, and the laws of the commonwealth of Australia which are in force in Western Australia.
2. The parties to this guarantee and indemnity submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Western Australia and the relevant federal courts and courts competent to hear appeals from those courts.

Consideration

3. Variation

16.
